## Why Should You Step Forward in Faith?

**Forward in Faith** combines two stewardship efforts to sustain St. Thomas's current growth, and to ensure that we have all the elements in place for long-term success.

#### Replenish our annual operating fund

We welcome pledges of all amounts to support the continued growth of our parish and the many ways it nourishes us individually and as a community.

## Help our current and future rectors live among the St. Thomas community

Our second goal is to further solidify support of Rector Housing. A Rector Housing Fund was established in 2024 for the first time in the history of St. Thomas parish. This fund is intended to provide the financial support needed to make high quality and local housing available to our rector. During Year 1 of our Forward in Faith campaign, substantial pledges of support were given by parish members. Our focus in Year 2 is the fulfillment of these pledges and seeking further support from those called to give to this ministry.

Rector housing is critical to the health of the parish and a successful Rector call. Reasons for this include:

- The rector is expected to be close, and available outside regular hours, unlike anyone else in the parish. Having our rector live in our community means they can build deeper, more meaningful relationships with parishioners and connections with community leaders. This helps them better support parishioners and attract new members.
- Being able to provide housing options and support makes us a more attractive employer. There are more parishes seeking priests than priests seeking parishes. Of the over 100 parishes in the Diocese of Olympia, St. Thomas is one of the three largest, ranked among the "Grade A" parishes. We are the only grade A parish without a rectory or housing solution.
- The soaring cost of housing on the Eastside presents a long-term challenge for our parish. Those of us who have lived here awhile have experienced rising home prices and rents that outpace wage growth. This isn't a problem we can wait out.

We believe this is the first time in St. Thomas history that we have not had a rector live on the east side of Lake Washington. The increased demands on commute time and limitations it places on both the rector and the parish makes it undesirable for all of us.



## GUIDANCE FOR GIVING

#### **Discern**

Pray for a spirit of discernment to guide you as you consider how to share your financial resources in our *Forward in Faith* campaign. The call is to contribute to the Annual Operating Fund AND offer generous gifts above and beyond annual stewardship to our Rector Housing Fund, if you haven't already made that commitment. Tune your heart to discover new ways to share.

#### **Commit**

We are seeking *everyone's* involvement in this campaign – return your pledge card today, or share it during Commitment Sunday on November 16. More than the dollar amount, the key is the level of generosity each of us expresses. Everyone's precious gifts are needed!

#### Celebrate

Give thanks for the abundance in your life and for the calling you have to carry out God's work in this place.





## Annual operating fund


#### Goal for 2026 = \$1,250,000

With this campaign, we are working toward sustaining our annual operating expenses and at the same time decreasing our reliance on our reserves to cover our budget gap. By meeting our goal of \$1,250,000, we anticipate narrowing our deficit to approximately \$150K in 2026.

We invite you to consider increasing your pledge to help us meet this goal.

The strength of the capacity to give by this parish was demonstrated last year. 155 Households made a pledge to our Annual Operating Fund to meet our goal of \$1,100,000, including 20 first-time pledgers for 2025! The average pledge for 2025 was \$7,174 and the median \$3,640, an increase of 33% and 40% over 2024!

Since 2019, our number of pledging households has decreased. We hope to increase the number of pledging households in 2026 to 180. We encourage everyone to pledge – no matter the amount – and if you are able, consider moving up to the "next tier" to help us meet our goal again this year!



## CREATIVE GIFT PLANNING

For many of us, our first thought when asked to contribute to a worthy cause is to give from our income. The parish is living proof of the generosity that has been afforded the parish through this sharing of income. Often, however, gifts for capital campaigns are contributed in ways that are a sharing of wealth from assets we may hold other than cash and checkbooks. For this campaign, we are encouraging everyone to think outside the conventional box about ways of sharing.

#### Gifts of Appreciated Investments

Donations of appreciated long-term stocks, mutual funds, or other investments are an excellent way to support our church. If your portfolio has experienced above average growth in 2025, consider sharing some of this appreciation with the parish. This extraordinary growth may give you the ability to give extraordinarily! When you donate appreciated investments, you do not pay capital gains tax, and you receive a charitable deduction for the full fair market value on the date of the donation.

#### Gifting from an IRA

You can make a tax-free charitable contribution to the church from your IRA. The contribution must be made directly from your IRA to the church and, if you are 73 or older it may be made as a Qualified Charitable Contribution from your Required Minimum Distribution. This could also take the form of moving legacy gifting forward.

#### Real Property as a Charitable Gift

There are two main methods for real estate to be given as a charitable gift. The first is an outright gift of the property. This is the simplest, most direct method resulting in the most immediate tax benefit. The second method involves bequests either through one's will, establishment of trusts or annuities. For the latter there are various tax benefits depending upon the specifics of the bequest and upon the individual's life circumstances and desires.

#### <u>Bundling</u>

With the doubling of the standard deduction, there's a reduced incentive to itemize. Since you must itemize to claim a charitable deduction, consider "bundling" your charitable gift. With bundling, you simply alter the timing of your giving so that you exceed the standard deduction and reap a tax deduction. For example, instead of donating \$4,000 annually for each of three years, consider giving \$12,000 all at once. It's the same gift as before, but if you coordinate it with your other potential deductions, you may be able to take advantage of the deduction in a year you itemize.

#### **Donor Advised Funds**

For those that have access to a Donor Advised Fund, this creates another opportunity to make a generous gift to St. Thomas.
